Notes for EDWARD ADAM MEYERS:

From Barbara Johnston: Meyer Family survived the Peshtigo Fire in a well with a mattress over their head. When the mattress dried the family would wet the mattress and put it over their heads. Edward was three years old when the Peshtigo Fire ripped through Northeast Wisconsin.

From Sylvester Meyers: Would only go to the Baptist Church when the kids were in the Christmas Program, otherwise wouldn't be caught dead in a Baptist Church. Sneaked the first five children into a Catholic Church to be baptized. When he was dying, a priest was called for to administer last rites, however the priest charged too much so Minnie wouldn't pay.

Edward A. Meyers, 79, Pioneer Resident of Pound, died at 1:30 this morning at his home after a long illness. He was born in Pine Grove, Brown County, April 7, 1868, and came to the town of Pound in 1887. On Oct. 8, 1898, he was married to Minnie Kobus. After being employed 15 years as a shingle packer he purchased a farm. He also was a census taker, and served as assessor and clerk of the township several years. Besides his wife, he is survived by six sons, William and Sylvester of Lena, Henry and Math of Pound, Joseph of Milwaukee and Louis, Marinette; three daughters, Mrs. Elmer



Koepsel of Elkhart Lake, Wis., Mrs. John Ellie of Coleman, and Mrs. Orin Voight, Milwaukee; Brothers, John of Green Bay, and Mike of Tipler, Wis.; 22 grandchildren. A daughter, Mrs. Walter Shanazinski, died in December 1946.

The body, which may be viewed Thursday evening, will be at the Rhodes mortuary here until Friday noon, when it will be taken to the residence. Rites will be held at the residence at 1 o'clock Saturday afternoon and in the Pioneer Baptist Church, Pound, at 2 o'clock. The Rev. County Board Elects Mark Anderson Chair, 17 to 12

For 12 years, from 1992 through 2004, Mark Anderson represented District 11, towns of Porterfield and Wagner, on Marinette County Board. He spent many of those years as County Board chair. With a job, a young family, and a dairy farm to care for, Anderson decided to step down from his county office, and did not seek reelection in 2004.

A dozen years later, on Tuesday, April 5, 2016 voters of Anderson's district returned him to office, and at the annual reorganization meeting on Tuesday, April 19, 17 members of the 30-member County Board voted him back into his old position as County Board chair. There were 12 votes cast for outgoing Chair Vilas Schroeder of the Town of Peshtigo. Supervisor Alice Baumgarten was absent and excused.

Supervisor Kathy Just, who represents the towns of Lake and Middle Inlet, was returned as vice chair with 17 votes to 11 for Supervisor Fred Meintz, Peshtigo.

This may have been a record turnover year for County Board, with eight new members, including Anderson, joining the 22 incumbents who were returned to office.

Among new supervisors on the 30-member board are Mark Anderson's son, Josh, who represents, District 15, Town of Porterfield; Dennis Marcely, District 3, towns of Athelstane and Dunbar; William Stankevich, District 5, towns of Athelstane, Goodman and Silver Cliff; George Kloppenburg, District 6, towns of Amberg and Wausaukee; Janis Porfilio, District 12, Town of Stephenson and Village of Crivitz; Glenn Broderick, District 15, Town of Pound and villages of Coleman and Pound; and Christopher A. Schmidt, District 17, towns of Grover and Peshtigo.

In accord with board rules, County Clerk Kathy Brandt presided over the meeting until the new chair was elected and seated.

Invocation was offered by Aaron Hubert, lead pastor for New Life Church. Hubert explained that “invocation” means “invitation,” and said his prayer was an invitation and a request for God to be part of the proceedings.

“It is an honor to be trusted with the mantle of leadership,” Hubert told the board as he prayed that they will carry it well.

Judge David Miron of Marinette County Circuit Court Branch 1, administered the oath of office to the 29 supervisors present. All are beginning new two-year terms.

Supervisor Russ Bauer nominated Anderson.

Veteran Supervisor Ted Sauve, himself a former County Board chair, stepped to the podium to nominate Schroeder and speak on his behalf. “It is imperative that Vilas Schroeder continue as chair,” Sauve told the board. He cited Schroeder’s “profound management skills,” and declared “Marinette County is on the verge of greatness,” and needs to continue on that path. He said Schroeder works well with the new administrator, and together they developed a 2016 county budget that resulted in a slight decrease in property taxes.

There were no other nominations. Brandt instructed supervisors to use the paper note pads at their desks to write their votes, and Assistant Clerk Bobbie Borkowski collected the ballots.

Brandt explained this was one of only two secret ballots they are allowed to cast as supervisors. The other would be for County Board vice chair. She and Borkowski counted the votes and pronounced Anderson the winner.

Brandt then introduced “your new chairman” and Anderson took the chairman’s seat at the front of the board room.

“There was nothing personal here,” Anderson explained of his decision to seek the chairman’s post. “I appreciate the work you have done and look forward to working with you on this transition,” he told Schroeder. He said he had met previously with Schroeder and County Administrator Shawn Hennessee to discuss issues.

Anderson described himself as a strong advocate of strategic planning, and said the board needs to question the amounts borrowed for capital improvements in recent years. He said interest rates are low, but the money will need to be paid back. “We need to question if we should continue to burden our children and grandchildren with this debt,” he declared.

He invited nominations for County Board Vice Chair.

Supervisor Al Sauld nominated incumbent vice chair Kathy Just, and Supervisor Robert Holley nominated Fred Meintz.

Supervisor Don Pazynski, speaking in favor of Just, said “The role of vice chair is more than just being on the sidelines...the vice chair must be prepared to take over as chair if necessary.

“She has very capably demonstrated her ability,” Pazynski said of Just. “As vice chair she has sat in on many committee meetings to keep abreast of what is taking place.”

Supervisor Ken Keller also spoke on Just’s behalf. He expressed agreement with Pazynski, and noted that not only did Just attend the many committee meetings, she did so without compensation.

The same voting procedure was followed as the vote for chair. When the ballots were tallied the result was 17 votes for Just, 11 for Meintz, and one for Supervisor David Zahn, who was not a nominee.

Just thanked the board for their support and told them, “I am a looker at what’s happening and I will continue to do that, and do a good job for you,” she promised.

Anderson appointed Committee on Committees, which by board rules includes the board chair and vice chair, and five other supervisors, two from cities and three from either villages or towns.

Supervisor Mike Behnke of Peshtigo and Shirley Kaufman of Marinette were named to represent city districts; while Bauer, Town of Peshtigo; Cheryl Wruk, towns of Stephenson and Silver Cliff, and Robert Holley, towns of Beaver and Pound, filled the other spots.

After deliberating for half an hour the Committee on Committees returned to the Board Room with its list of committee assignments already in printed form.

Schroeder had been appointed to the Health and Human Services Committee, but was not happy with that duty, so Anderson invited anyone interested in working with them to come forward. Hennessee said they

should contact him and he would take steps to get them seated on the committee. Before the meeting adjourned Supervisor Joe Banaszak had volunteered and his membership was approved.

All other Committee on Committee appointments were approved as presented. The committees then met and each selected a chair and vice chair and set meeting times and dates. Committee chairs plus the board chair and vice chair automatically make up the Executive Committee, and each committee selects a representative to serve on the Buildings and Property Committee.

Members of the Executive Committee are Mark Anderson-Chair, Kathy Just-Vice Chair, Cheryl Wruk-Agriculture and Extension Education, Mike Behnke-Building and Property, Shirley Kaufman-Economic Development, Vilas Schroeder-Finance, Al Mans-Forestry, Al Sauld-Health and Human Services, Russ Bauer-Highway, Ted Sauve-Land Information, Ken Keller-Law Enforcement, and Joe Policello-Personnel.

By board rules membership on the Health and Human Services Board, unlike standing committees, is by appointment of the County Administrator, upon recommendation of the Committee on Committees, and subject to approval of the County Board.

Members of numerous other boards and commissions are also appointed by the administrator and/or board chair with board approval. Among them is the Marinette County representative to the Wisconsin County Forest Association. Mans has filled that position for two years, but someone else was initially named, and Mans wondered why. Anderson said he was not aware of that, and Mans retained the appointment.

All assignments were made and approved by 10:30 a.m. The reorganization meeting was adjourned and the board proceeded with regular business of the day.

Marinette County Administrator Shawn Henessee explained he had met with new supervisors and some continuing ones for several hours on Monday, April 18 for orientation.

Corporation Counsel Gale Mattison explained legal issues, including that individual supervisors can come to her with questions pertaining to county government, but she is legal counsel for the board as a whole, not for individual supervisors.

She stressed that, "There are no meetings outside of meetings." Supervisors must not get together for discussions of county business outside of properly noticed meetings, and cannot use today's technology like face books and e-mails to accomplish the same thing.

Keller asked if they could share information with other supervisors if they didn't make personal preferences known, but Mattison advised that too should be given to the person who sends out the meeting notices for distribution.

As to gifts, gratuities, etc., she advised, "If you feel that there's a question, you probably shouldn't accept it," and quoted advice from Finance Director Pat Kass: "Just be aware that whatever you do might show up on the 6 o'clock news."

Local Biebs finds attention ridiculous

Local sheriff's races don't typically garner national attention, but Shawano police officer Adam Bieber's bid to unseat incumbent Shawano County Sheriff Randy Wright became fodder this week for the gossip pages.

Celebrity news web site tmz.com on Tuesday posted a photo of one of Bieber's campaign signs, which reads, "Elect Bieber Sheriff," along with a short story headlined, "Bieber running for sheriff in Wisconsin," with the implication that the story was about singer-songwriter Justin Bieber.

The headline made the rounds on Twitter, with some linking to the tmz.com story and others offering their reactions, such as, "What has the world come to," "Do you think he will win?" and "Great, so now Justice is Blind and Dumb."

The tmz story takes a couple of paragraphs to make clear that it's Adam Bieber, not Justin. It also includes a photo of Adam Bieber, apparently taken from his Facebook page.

"Adam's creating confusion by not putting his first name on the signs," the tmz story states. "Maybe it's a way of attracting young female voters."

The story also suggests that since Bieber has made drug-sniffing dogs a campaign priority, Justin Bieber might want to stay out of Shawano County.

Bieber — Adam, that is — said Tuesday the attention was "kind of neat, but it's ridiculous when you think about it."

The attention is apparently not stopping with tmz.com.

Bieber said he has also been contacted by E! Entertainment, which runs a basic cable channel and an entertainment news site, asking about his campaign platform.

He said he doesn't know how these organizations are finding him, or why.

"I think it's ridiculous," Bieber said. "I'm sure there are a lot of famous people named Wright."

Marinette Man Dies in Mishap

A Marinette man, Louis P. Meyers, 55 of 2434 Bang St. was crushed to death in an industrial accident at Unit Structures Department of Koppers Company Inc., Peshtigo at 7 AM today.

Richard Matty of Crivitiz, Marinette County coroner said death was immediate due to a crushed skull.

James Weisenborn; plant manager stated that this was the first fatal accident in over 20 years of operation.

The plant manager said Meyers came on duty for the 6 AM shift and was working with a loading crew of six men in the finishing department at the time of the mishap.

"The Crew was about to wrap several arches with weigh 4,000 pounds apiece in preparation for loading onto railroad cars for shipment," Weisenborn said. "The arches had been stained and varnished Thursday and were braced against a wall," he explained.

"Two cranes were being used to get the arches," the plant manager continued. "They picked up one but it flipped in the wrong direction and struck several of the arches braced against the wall, knocking them over. One of the arches fell on Meyers."

Matty stated that the arches are approximately 70 to 80 feet in length and are about 2 1/2 feet in width. "One of the plant officials told me this morning that the firm had been using the same procedure for shipment for 20 some years and they never had an accident until today," the corner reported.

Lawrence Dura, a member of the loading crew, narrowly escaped injury as he leapt to safety when the arches tumbled. The other loading crew members were Dennis Hasenfus, Donald Champagne, Roy Deschaine and John Klimczak.

Meyers was born October 18, 1910 in the Town of Pound and had resided in Marinette for 30 years. He was the president of the local carpenters union and a member of the First Methodist Church. He married the former Hazel Bancroft in 1933.

Survivors include his widow, a son Gerald of Marinette, five brothers Henry of Pound, Sylvester of Beaver, Matt of Gillett, Joseph of Milwaukee and William of Berlin; three sisters John Ellie of Coleman, Mrs. Orrin Voight of Milwaukee and Mrs. Elmer Koepsel of Mayville and four grand children.
